



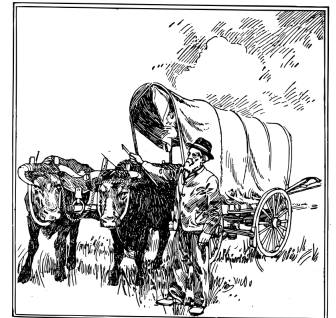
Famous Pioneers Logic Puzzle

Description: Use the clues provided to solve this emigrant pioneer themed logic puzzle.

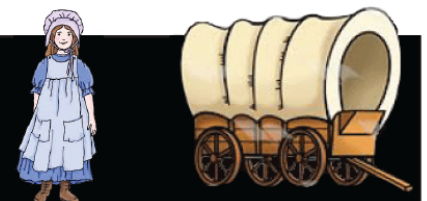

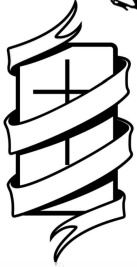
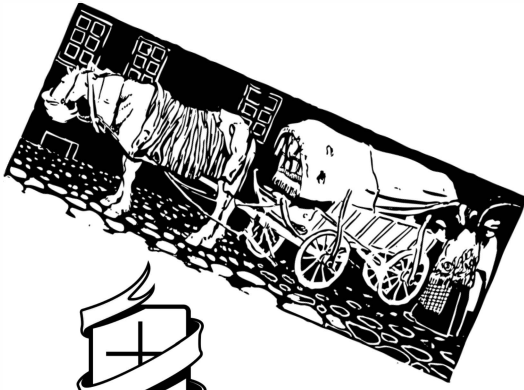
Clues:

2. The Martin Company did not suffer from Native American Conflict.
3. The Donner Party traveled before the Martin Company, but after the Whitman Party.
4. The Martin Company was seeking freedom from religious persecution.
5. The Whitmans were not headed to California.
6. The party seeking to get free farmland was not headed to Utah or Oregon.
7. The company seeking to start a mission traveled first.
8. The party seeking to start a mission was not plagued by snow on their journey.
9. The group that traveled last got stuck in Wyoming, not far from Casper.
10. The first party to travel was headed to Oregon Country.

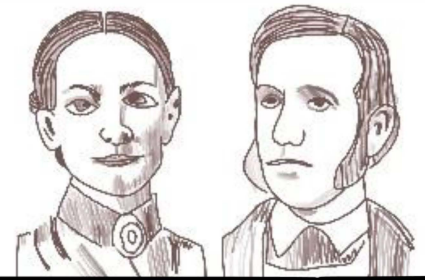
