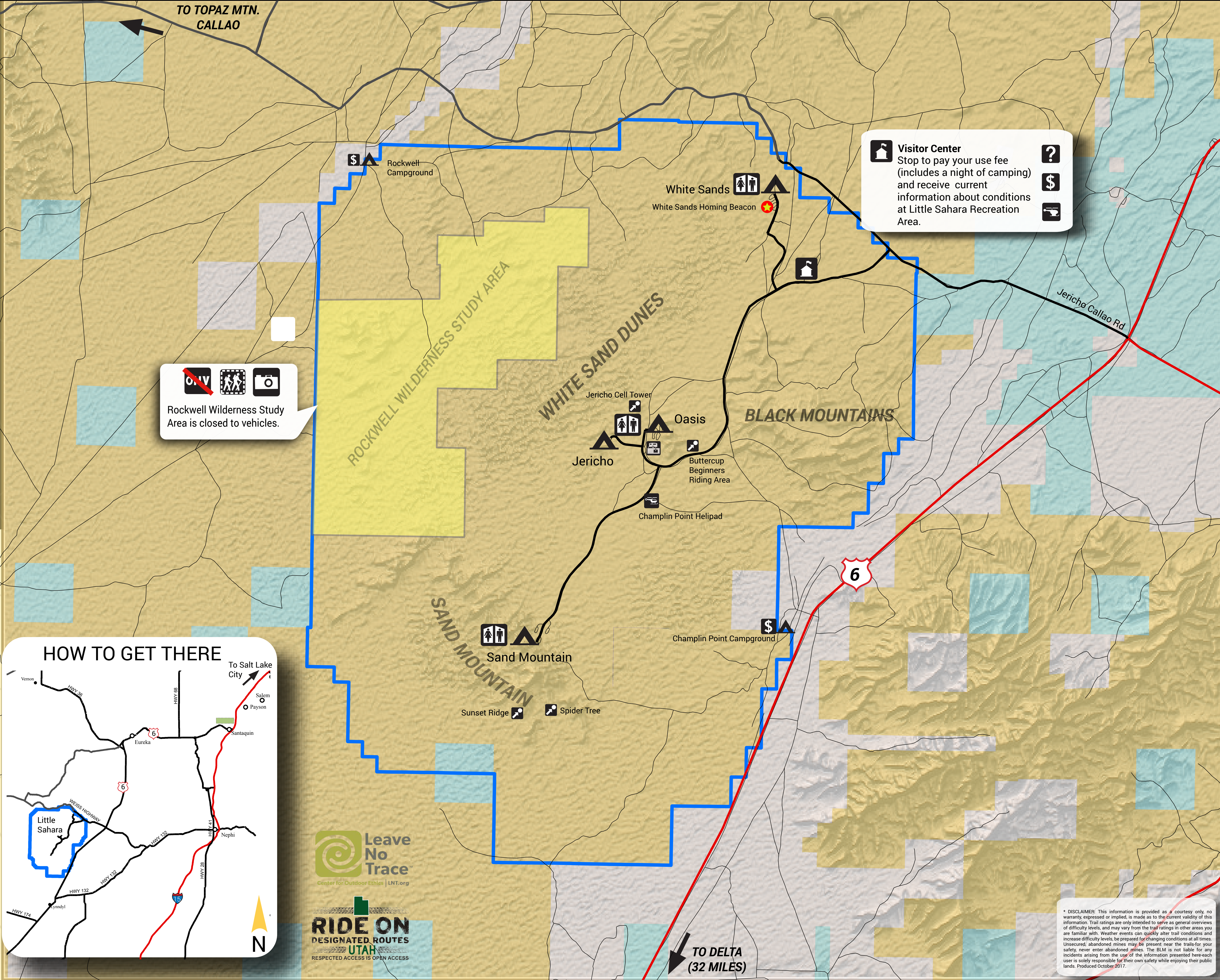

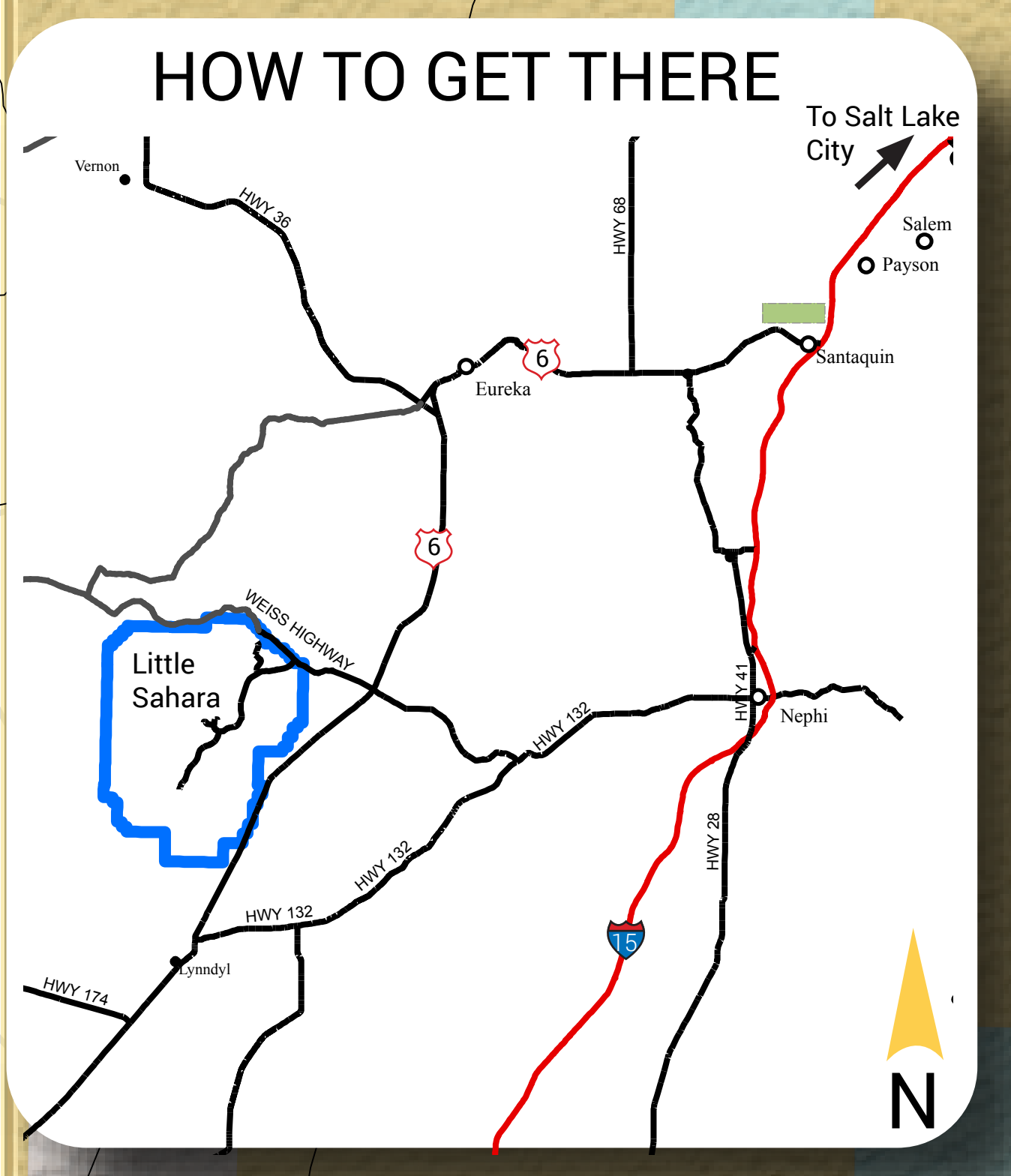

- ### THINGS TO KNOW
- All vehicles should be equipped with at least one spare tire, tools, and supplies to deal with emergencies.
 - Stay Aware! Riders are injured or killed each year from avoidable accidents.
 - Whip flags are required for all vehicles.
 - Helmets are recommended for everyone and required for visitors under the age of 18.
 - Obey all signs and fences: Little Sahara features two fenced-in, non-motorized, play areas for children at White Sands and Jericho Campgrounds.
 - Vehicles are prohibited in the Rockwell Wilderness Study Area/ Outstanding Natural Area.



Rockwell Wilderness Study Area is closed to vehicles.
