NLCS RESEARCH SUPPORT PROGRAM – REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS – ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

The NLCS Research Support Program aims to increase the effectiveness of resource management by financially supporting scientific research that informs effective decision-making in the BLM. The Program seeks to engage the external scientific community in conducting management-focused, scientific research in the NLCS.

General Program Guidelines

Proposals must:

- Describe research that will inform effective decision-making in the BLM;
- Tier from the NLCS 15-year Strategy, the relevant State NLCS Strategy, the BLM Science Strategy and/or the NLCS Science Strategy;
- Address specific, credible, and relevant questions, usually identified in the NLCS unit's Resource Management Plan (RMP), RMP implementation plan, and/or science plan;
- Be designed around a clearly articulated research question(s), including for assessment, inventory, and monitoring projects;
- Describe research that takes place in a NLCS unit(s);
 - Projects spanning multiple land ownerships may apply for partial funding for the portion occurring on NLCS land. These types of projects must demonstrate relevance to the NLCS.
- Be for one-year projects, as multi-year funding is not guaranteed. Multi-year projects will only be considered if they are designed to produce a discrete product at the end of one year;
- Be consistent with all applicable laws, regulations, policies, and plans; and,
- Not require additional impact analysis.

Funding Limit:

Up to \$25,000

Number of Awards:

The NLCS anticipates making 20 to 30 awards in FY2013.

Proposal Requirements

- Proposals must be written as a stand-alone research proposal and include the following sections:
 - Introduction/background;
 - Research questions/hypotheses;
 - Research methods, including data analysis;
 - Results to date (if any);
 - Public engagement/education (if any);
 - Benefits of project;
 - Including how the project supports the unit's plans and/or conservation, protection, and restoration of the unit's designated values;
 - Detailed timeline of project;
 - Detailed budget;
 - Including details about matching funds and partner contributions;
 - Deliverables (e.g. reports, peer-reviewed articles, GIS files, outreach tools);
 - At a minimum, proposals must describe how/when partners will provide the BLM:
 - Annual progress reports;

- A final report, suitable for distribution to BLM staff;
- A manager's summary (<1 pg. report that helps inform managers' decisions); and,
- A brief synopsis suitable for a broad public audience.
- o Partner's qualifications, affiliation, and contact details (including email); and,
- Relevant pictures (if any no more than three);
- All proposals, including all attachments, must be submitted as a single PDF file.
- Letters of Support from BLM Field Offices and State Offices are not necessary. WO-410 will assume all proposals submitted by the State NLCS Leads have both Field and State support.

Partner-Conducted Research

- Applications will only be accepted from partners possessing active assistance agreements with the BLM. Field Offices are responsible for ensuring that an active assistance agreement is in place.
 - o Funding will not be awarded to individuals or for-profit organizations.
- Partners are strongly encouraged to work with the relevant Field Office in order to tailor the research proposal to meet the science needs of the Field Office.
- Partners must conduct all the labor for the project; partner labor is an appropriate budget expense.
 - BLM labor is not supported except if BLM resources are used to facilitate access for researchers to designated Wilderness, Wilderness Study Areas, or Wild and Scenic Rivers.

Evaluation of Proposals

State Evaluation

- State NLCS Leads may establish internal deadlines for submission of proposals from Field Offices. In this case, Field Offices and partners must be adequately informed of the earlier deadline.
- State NLCS Leads will rank proposals and submit them through this SharePoint site, no later than 5:00pm EST on February 1, 2013. WO-410 encourages State NLCS Leads to work with other State Program Leads and State Leadership when ranking proposals.
- State NLCS Leads are advised to notify the State Grants Management Officer of the proposals submitted to WO-410 for consideration in order to help prepare for any additional workloads.

National Evaluations

- A Washington Office inter-disciplinary team will review and rank submitted proposals. The team will consider in their review, if the proposal:
 - Improves BLM management of the NLCS and beyond the NLCS;
 - Fills knowledge gaps;
 - Has credible methods, budgets, deliverables, etc.;
 - Involves public involvement and/or education;
 - Includes matching contributions;
 - o Is clearly written; and,
 - For partners that have received funding in the past:
 - If the partner has submitted reports, success stories, photographs, etc.
- WO-NLCS will consider the State NLCS Lead's rankings, the Washington Office team's rankings, and other national priorities when making funding decisions.
