Naming Convention for Citation Title for Geospatial Metadata

The metadata citation title is the metadata element that is used for display in Geoportal search results. The chance for duplication is reduced, and the public understanding of the metadata is increased if a standard naming convention is used when naming metadata records. A metadata record name should be structured from the key topic that the metadata describes, two or three descriptive terms, and the State/region that the data set covers.

This standard will be implemented immediately on newly published metadata documents. Legacy titles of existing metadata already published to the Geoportal will be edited to conform to this new structure upon replacement through an established update cycle. Coordination may be required when new documents have similar or the same names that already exist within the portal.

Renaming of the citation title is not to be done without coordination with the originating office and other offices affected by such a change.

The convention for naming the citation consists of 6 parts, some of which are optional.

Other Rules:

- Be as specific as possible, and concise with citation names.
- Only use spaces between words; no underscores, hyphens or special characters; only alphanumeric.
- If an acronym is used, use all capitals, otherwise use Title Case.
- Use only abbreviations or acronyms that are universally known. The BLM standard abbreviations are available in the Corporate Metadata Repository (CMR).
- This Citation title is not an abstract and does not need to be all inclusive. Additional information may be added in the Abstract, if necessary.
