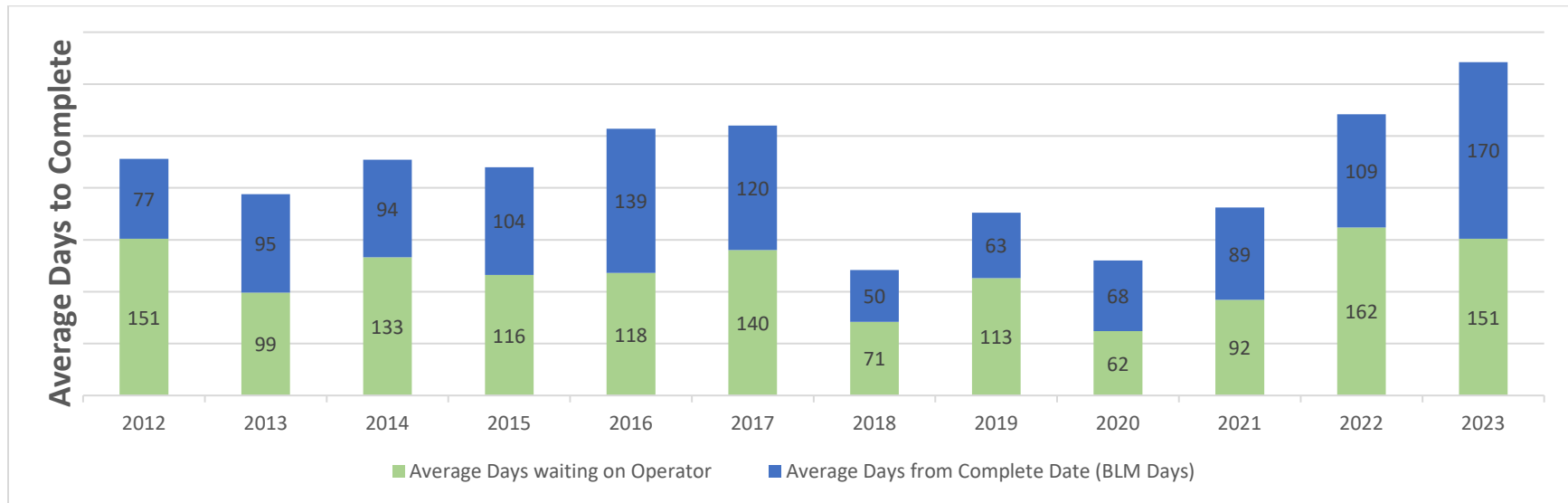

1. When the BLM receives an Application for Permit to Drill (APD) from an operator, the AFMSS starts tracking the time the APD is in the system. This time includes non-business days and is broken up by whether or not the APD is complete. The time from submission until the APD is complete counts as operator's days. Once the APD is complete, the time counts as time spent by the BLM, even if an APD is deferred for other reasons. Recent causes that have extended the time for both the BLM and industry to complete preparation and processing of APDs:
 - a. Industry prioritization: Operators submit APDs on their projected drilling schedule. The drilling schedule can change resulting in different APDs being the priority. BLM offices will work with operators to accommodate their changes in priority resulting in APDs pending in a holding status increasing the overall processing timeframe.
 - b. Court decisions: Court decisions that require the BLM to reevaluate APDs or leases are ultimately counted as part of processing time.
 - c. BLM resources: The BLM continues to work to hire and maintain sufficient resources to address the volume of APDs submitted.
