NOTICE OF APPEAL

The forest management decision covering Gate Creek Salvage Timber Sale, contract number ORN05-TS21-544 has been administratively appealed to the Interior Board of Land Appeals (IBLA). The appellant has also requested a stay of the decision. The IBLA may grant a stay suspending the forest management decision. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will proceed with normal bidding on the tract.

Although the BLM does not know at this time what decisions IBLA will issue, the BLM is providing this notice to advise all bidders that significant delays may occur before award of the contract or before any operations may be undertaken. Additionally, an adverse ruling may require the BLM to suspend, cancel or modify the contract. The Authorized Officer retains the right to reject all bids associated with this tract.

Any written bids submitted prior to bidder receipt of written notification of this appeal may be withdrawn prior to the start of oral bidding.

To ensure that this notice is understood, the bidders for this contract must sign the acknowledgement below and submit this document to the BLM to confirm their bid.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

I acknowledge receipt of a copy of this notice and understand that because of the appeal and request for stay lodged with IBLA, any decision to award the Gate Creek Salvage Timber Sale, contract number ORN05-TS21-544 may be significantly delayed, or operations suspended, and that the BLM has authority under 43 CFR 5442.3 to reject all bids if the Government determines it is in the Government's interest to do so.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Bureau of Land Management will offer for sale timber as described herein for oral auction, pursuant to Instructions to Bidders, as stated on Form No. 5440-9, attached. Written and oral bids will be received by the District Manager, or their representative, at the **SPRINGFIELD INTERAGENCY OFFICE**, **NORTHWEST OREGON DISTRICT OFFICE**, **3106 PIERCE PARKWAY**, **SPRINGFIELD**, **OREGON**. The timber sale will commence at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, **July 29, 2021**.

THIS TIMBER SALE NOTICE does <u>not</u> constitute the decision document for purposes of appeal of a forest management decision. Consistent with 43 CFR Subpart 5003.2(b), the date the BLM posts the forest management decision on the BLM's ePlanning website establishes the effective date of the decision for purposes of an administrative appeal. A WRITTEN BID on Form 5440-9 at not less than the appraised price on a unit basis per species and the required minimum bid deposit shall be required to participate in oral bidding for each tract.

THE SUCCESSFUL BIDDER, as a condition of award, will be required to complete and/or sign the following forms:

- 1. Form 5430-11, a certification that the bid was arrived at by the bidder or offerer independently and was tendered without collusion with any other bidder or offerer.
- 2. Form 5450-17, Export Determination.

PRE-AWARD QUALIFICATIONS. The high bidder may be required to furnish information to determine the ability to perform the obligations of the contract. If the high bidder is determined not qualified, not responsible or refuses to respond within 15 days of a request for information pertaining to qualifications, the contract may be offered and awarded for the amount of the high bid to the highest of the bidders who is qualified, responsible, and willing to accept the contract.

A PERFORMANCE BOND in an amount not less than 20 percent of the total purchase price will be required for all contracts of \$2,500.00 or more, but the amount of the bond shall not be in excess of \$500,000.00, except when the Purchaser opts to increase the minimum bond as provided in 43 CFR 5451.2. INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS may be authorized for sales of \$500.00 or more. Required installments will be determined by BLM. For sales under \$500,000.00, installments will not be less than 10% of the total purchase price. For sales of \$500,000.00 or more, installment payments shall be \$50,000.00.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION. All timber sales, including timber from Federal rights-of-ways, shall be subject to the restrictions relating to the export and substitution of unprocessed timber from the United States in accordance with P.L. 94-165 and 43 CFR 5400 and 5424, as amended.

LOG EXPORT AND SUBSTITUTION RESTRICTIONS. Excepting Port-Orford-cedar, all timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS. A revised Special Provision has been added to the contract which enables the Contracting Officer to suspend the contract to facilitate protection of certain plant or animal species, and/or to modify or terminate the contract when necessary to: (1) Comply with the Endangered Species Act or to prevent incidental take of northern spotted owls in accordance with management direction in the Record of Decision (ROD) and Resource Management Plan (RMP), or; (2) Comply with a stay or remedy issued by the Interior Board of Land Appeals or a court order, or; (3) Protect species which were identified for protection in accordance with management direction established in the ROD and RMP.

<u>APPRAISED PRICES</u> are calculated by determining market value through the analytical appraisal method. The minimum bid increment will be \$0.10 per MBF or multiples thereof.

<u>LOG EXPORT RESTRICTIONS</u>: All timber offered for sale hereunder is restricted from export from the United States in the form of unprocessed timber and is prohibited from being used as a substitute for exported private timber.

<u>NOTE</u>: The volume for this timber sale has been calculated using 16 foot eastside Scribner rules, and the 32 foot log volumes are estimates derived from the 16 foot volumes.

<u>CRUISE INFORMATION</u>: The timber volume for Douglas-fir in the Hazard Tree Removal Area was based on 100% cruise and on a variable plot cruise for estimating board foot volume. The timber volume for the Salvage Harvest Area was based on a variable plot cruise for estimating board foot volume. Plots were measured using a 40 basal area factor for a total of 88 plots. A map showing the location and description of the sample trees is available at the Northwest Oregon District's Springfield Interagency Office.

With respect to merchantable Douglas-fir (sample) trees: The average tree is 14.5" DBHOB; the average log contains 55 bd. ft.; the total gross merchantable volume is approximately 1,422 MBF; and 81% recovery is expected.

BLM Designation by Description (DxD) Scale Sale Timber Sale Process

Operations on this timber sale will be conducted under a Designation by Description (DxD) scale contract. DxD is also referred to as "Purchaser Select." This is a method of sale where the Government does not mark (paint) the timber to be cut and removed in the Salvage Harvest Area and Hazard Tree Removal Areas. Instead, the timber to be cut is designated by description, i.e., written cutting guidelines (Selection Criteria) which implement the silvicultural prescription and are made a requirement of the timber sale contract in accordance with Section 41(c) and 41(d).

 Cruise: The variable plot cruise was implemented with the cruiser using the Selection Criteria for cutting in order to estimate the volume that would be cut and removed. The estimated volume was used for appraisal purposes and is delineated in this timber sale notice. In addition, this volume is delineated in the attached Exhibit B, and will be used to bill the Purchaser.

EXTENSION CREDITS: The Purchase of this salvage timber entitles the Purchaser to volume-for-volume and contract term-for-contract term extensions without reappraisal of qualifying BLM contracts for green timber held by the Purchaser.

CUTTING AREA: Approximately 40 acres of Salvage Harvest and 51 acres Hazard Tree Removal totaling 91 acres.

ACCESS: Access to the sale is provided by:

- 1. A public road;
- 2. BLM existing roads;
- 3. Roads covered by Right-of-Way and Road Use Agreement E-662 between Weyerhaeuser Company and the United States. DURATION OF CONTRACT: Duration of the contract will be 18 months for cutting and removal of timber.

<u>SPECIAL PROVISIONS</u>: The contract will contain special provisions regarding road renovation, road maintenance, logging methods, prevention of erosion, falling of all trees designated for cutting, logging residue reduction, and submission of a written logging plan specifying equipment trail locations, landing locations, logging methods, and logging schedule.

Under Sec. 26 of the timber sale contract, ground-based logging and mechanized felling will be prohibited during periods of excessive soil moisture. This will normally limit ground based logging to July 1 to October 15.

OTHER SPECIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- Prior to felling trees within the Salvage Harvest Area and Hazard Tree Removal Areas, the Purchaser shall require all timber cutters to meet on site with the Authorized Officer to review the selection criteria in Section 41(c) and 41(d).
- In the Hazard Tree Removal Areas, full suspension of logs is required over streams. No equipment, skid trails, landings, or log decks are permitted in stream courses.
- The Purchaser shall be required to control traffic during active operations and roads shall not be blocked for more than 20 minutes at a time during operations.
- Purchaser shall provide warning signs and flaggers in accordance with state and federal regulations.
- The Purchaser shall clean logging, road, decommissioning, and slash disposal equipment prior to entry on BLM lands.
- Whole tree yarding, or yarding with tops attached, will be required in the Salvage Harvest Area, unless approved by the Authorized Officer.
- In the Special Operating Areas, equipment shall remain on roads.
- In the Special Tailhold Area no tailholds or tailtrees are allowed.
- A yarding wedge will be required across Weyerhaeuser Company in Section 23.

- A yarding wedge will be required across Giustina Land and Timber Company in Section 24.
- Hazard trees shall be felled towards the road where feasible, except yellow painted trees.
- Approximately 300 yellow painted trees shall be felled toward the streams where safely possible and left on site.
- In the Hazard Tree Removal Areas, hazard trees 40" or greater DBH and greater than 171 years old, shall be cut and remain on site and placed to not create a downslope hazard.
- The Purchaser shall be required to cut and process non-merchantable trees in the Salvage Harvest Area and Hazard Tree Removal Areas.
- In-unit mechanized felling and ground based yarding shall occur between July 1 October 15.
- At the completion of yarding, the Purchaser shall decompact skid trail prisms.
- The Purchaser shall be required to spread BLM-provided seed and mulch at culverts and designated areas.
- The Purchaser shall perform logging residue reduction and site preparation work within the Salvage Harvest Area and Hazard Tree Removal Areas to include piling at landings and along roadsides, covering, and pile burning.
- The Purchaser shall be required to file a Notification of Operations with the Oregon Department of Forestry for all harvest operations on federal and private lands.

<u>Optional Contributions</u>: The Purchaser will not have the option of contributing funds in lieu of completing logging residue reduction work.





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
