Subject: Western Oregon Resource Advisory Council (RAC), Secure Rural

Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 (as

reauthorized as part of Public Law 117-58), Title II Project Funding

Recommendations

The Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 (the Act) (16 U.S.C. 7101 *et seq.*), as reauthorized in Public Law 117-58, allows Resource Advisory Councils to recommend distribution of funds under Title II of the Act. Secure Rural Schools funds under Title II are used by Federal agencies, State and local governments, private and nonprofit entities, and landowners for protection, restoration and enhancement of fish and wildlife habitat and other natural resource objectives on Federal land and on non-Federal land where projects would benefit these resources on Federal land.

Title II funds are retained by the Bureau of Land Management and are allocated to specific projects that have been reviewed and recommended by the Western Oregon RAC. Projects are considered for Title II funding if they make additional investments in, and create employment opportunities through:

- Improvement of existing infrastructure maintenance.
- Implementation of stewardship objectives that enhance forest ecosystems;
- Restoration and improvement of land health and water quality.

All funded projects must comply with all applicable Federal laws and regulations and must be consistent with the applicable resource management plans and with any watershed or subsequent plan developed pursuant to the resource management plan. The funds may be used for projects that have broad-based support and with objectives that include road, trail, and infrastructure maintenance or obliteration; soil productivity improvement; forest ecosystem health improvements; watershed restoration and maintenance; wildlife and fish habitat restoration, maintenance, and improvement; noxious and exotic weeds control; and native species reestablishment.

Many of the projects considered by the Western Oregon RAC were multi-county proposals. Therefore, for budget tracking purposes by county, please see the attached spreadsheet that was used to document the RAC's deliberations. If you have any questions on this spreadsheet or need additional information, please contact me.

Based on the proceedings and recommendations from the Western Oregon RAC meeting held on December 5 and 6, 2023, I concur and approve the use of funds from the Secure Rural Schools Community Self-Determination Act for the implementation of Title II projects identified in the enclosure. It is the Bureau of Land Management's determination that all projects recommended for funding by the Western Oregon RAC meet the purpose of the Act and are in the public interest.

Re: Western Oregon Resource Advisory Council (RAC) Recommendations for Funding of Projects Under the Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act of 2000 (the Act), as reauthorized in Public Law 117-58

Dear Ms. Whitman:

Based on the proceedings from the Western Oregon Resource Advisory Council (RAC) meeting held on December 5 and 6, 2023, the Western Oregon RAC recommends funding the projects identified in the attachment using Secure Rural Schools and Community Self-Determination Act funds. This recommendation is based on our understanding that all projects recommended for funding meet the purposes of the Act and are in the public interest.

In consultation with you, as the Designated Federal Officer (DFO), as well as other Bureau of Land Management staff, the RAC believes that all proposed project satisfy the following conditions:

- (1) Each project complies with all applicable Federal laws (including regulations).
- (2) Each project is consistent with the applicable resource management plan and with any watershed or subsequent plan developed pursuant to the resource management plan and approved by the Secretary concerned.
- (3) Each project was approved by the Western Oregon RAC in accordance with duties outlined in the law, including the procedures regarding a quorum of RAC members for approval.
- (4) A project description was submitted for each project.
- (5) Each project will improve the maintenance of existing infrastructure, implement stewardship objectives that enhance forest ecosystems, and restore and improve land health and water quality.

All reviewed projects are consistent with the current Resource Management Plans (RMP) for Western Oregon: Northwestern and Coastal Oregon RMP and the Southwestern Oregon RMP (August 2016) and will comply with all applicable Federal laws and regulations.

The RAC meeting was held in compliance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act (FACA) and Western Oregon RAC Charter requirements. A quorum was present at the meeting on December 5 and 6, 2023. All projects that were recommended for funding received majority support from all three RAC membership categories. Public notices for these meetings were published in the Federal Register, and a public forum time was incorporated into the agenda.

Applications for these projects were submitted to the RAC for their review consistent with the Act's requirements. The project applications contained the following information required for projects to be funded and were provided to all RAC members prior to the scheduled meetings:

- Purpose of the project
- Description of how the project meets the purposes of the Act
- Statement of how the project benefits O&C Lands and resources
- Expected duration and costs of the project
- Expected beneficial outcomes
- Monitoring plan

All projects will improve the maintenance of existing infrastructure, implement stewardship objectives that enhance forest ecosystems, and/or will restore and improve land health and water quality.

Please find attached the complete list of projects recommended for your approval.
