SITUATION

Current Situation: Today's operations included securing the fire line on both flanks of the fire. Crews on the Deer Springs Fire are continuing fire line construction to the south and containing any smaller fires that migrated off the rim. Operationally, the goal remains to keep the fire to the smallest acres/smallest footprint as possible and utilize standard firefighting techniques using existing roads, natural barriers, and equipment to safely suppress the fire.

Winds out of the north-northwest continue to be favorable for suppression tactics, and additional resources are arriving on scene, which continues to bolster containment efforts. Red Flag Warning remains in effect through Wednesday evening.

Evacuations: None. Should evacuations become necessary, the Kane County Sheriff's Office will make the initial evacuation notifications through Kane County's Community Emergency Notification System on Everbridge. Road Closures: Area and road closures are in effect. On Skutumpah Road between Johnson Canyon Road and Lick Wash the road is <u>open to resident trafficonly</u>.

Nephi Pasture and Crocodile parking lots, as well as Nephi Pasture Road are closed to the public as these areas will be used for fire operations only.

We <u>strongly discourage ALL recreational activities</u> in the Nephi Pasture Region and along Skutumpah Road.
