Amount Expended: \$38,118

Recreation fees supported interior cleaning and vault pumping of the vault toilets throughout the West Desert. These facilities offer a valuable service at our campgrounds and recreation sites but can be difficult and costly to maintain due to their remote nature.

- Supported work parties with the Southern Utah Wilderness Alliance to manage illegal trails in the Cedar Mountains.
- Installed four interpretive panels at the Silver Island Mountains along a well trafficked route.
- Made significant progress in controlling and mitigating dangerous firearm incidents at West Mountain.

The Salt Lake Field Office is coordinating with partner organizations in Tooele, Utah, and Salt Lake counties to aid in the appropriate construction of new trails. The BLM anticipates that up to 25 miles of non-motorized, single-track trails would be constructed within the Lake Mountains and up to 10 miles would be constructed within Rose and Yellow Fork Canyons.
