1150 – Threatened and Endangered Species Management
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sage-grouse/sagebrush habitat Conservation • Implementing recovery actions, biological opinions, or conservation agreements for listed and BLM sensitive species (desert tortoise, Lahontan cutthroat trout, Blue Butterfly, etc...)
