When completing the Worksheet for proposed lease reinstatements: (1) the "Proposed Action" should be described as a "Proposed Lease Reinstatement"; and (2) Questions 1 and 2 in Section D ordinarily will not require an explanation, because NEPA documents prepared for proposed planning or leasing decisions by their nature analyze the same geographic area and a range of alternatives that encompasses a lease reinstatement.
