- o BLM protects more than 870 scenic and iconic areas over 33 million acres in the country, including:
 - Red Rock Canyon,
 - Rio Grande del Norte,
 - Grand-Staircase Escalante.
 - Upper Missouri River Breaks,
 - the heart of the Sonoran Desert,
 - the canyonlands of southern Idaho, and
 - the King Range National Conservation Area along the coast of California.

• The BLM manages public lands and resources in every state across the nation.

- o One out of every 10 acres of land in the United States.
- Thirty percent (30%) of the nation's mineral estate.

• Here's why your BLM public lands matter:

- Your public lands makes solar, wind, and geothermal energy possible.

- Your BLM managed lands are home to more than 3,000 species of mammals, reptiles, amphibians, and birds.
